MoAD Announces Inaugural Edition of Nexus: SF/Bay Area Black Art Week, a New Annual Art Event Celebrating the Rich Landscape of the San Francisco Bay Area

First edition to run through October 1 - 6, 2024



SAN FRANCISCO – The Museum of the African Diaspora (MoAD) is extremely delighted to announce the inaugural edition of Nexus: SF/Bay Area Black Art Week, an annual event celebrating the Black arts landscape of the San Francisco Bay Area. The first event of its kind will entail a celebration lasting from Tuesday, October 1 through Sunday, October 6, 2024, featuring a range of institutions, galleries, and artists coming together to illuminate the richness of the Black artist community through special programming, exhibitions, and other unique engagements. Intended to uplift and enliven the Bay Area arts community, the week will culminate with MoAD's annual Afropolitan Ball fundraising gala on Saturday, October 5, an annual event that raises funds and brings critical awareness for the museum's work and its mission. Monetta White, Executive Director and CEO of MoAD, said, "As MoAD's Executive Director and a proud native of this vibrant region, I feel it is time to awaken the Bay Area and bring our incredible creative talent to the forefront of national and international recognition. Nexus: SF/Bay Area Black Art Week is not just an event; it is a movement to change the narrative about the art scene and to cultivate the economic and creative sectors that attract people to our region's cities. Through this event, we hope to enhance our collective visibility, encourage dialogue, and build more pathways and platforms to recognize and support Black artists and their contributions in the Bay Area."

Nexus was brought forward to recognize the unique and revolutionary legacies of Black arts and culture that have long been fostered within cities of San Francisco, Oakland, and the surrounding Bay Area. As a special initiative led by MoAD, it is a natural extension of the



museum's mission to celebrate and create space for Black culture, artistry, and cultural contributions through the global lens of the African Diaspora. Tied to MoAD's upcoming 20th anniversary in 2025, the event is intended to form an annual week of engagement and community connection that extends MoAD's mission out to its regional partners and wider audience.

"San Francisco's arts and cultural scene is on the cusp of an exciting renaissance, and I am thrilled MoAD is helping lead that charge with the inaugural Nexus: SF/Bay Area Black Art Week," said Ralph Remington, Director of Cultural Affairs at the San Francisco Arts Commission. "San Francisco's vibrant cultural landscape is not only thriving but evolving, defying the negative narratives of the past with support of our elected leaders, like Mayor London Breed, who are helping lead the charge to reimagine our downtown public spaces, filling them with accessible art experiences that are open for all to enjoy. The Arts Commission is excited to help support this initiative that helps uplift and showcase the art and culture of the African Diaspora."

The week culminates in MoAD's Afropolitan Ball on Saturday, October 5 at 6pm at the Galleria Design Center, the museum's most significant fundraising event that supports MoAD and its community-driven mission.
